KEY THOUGHTS

- We love mysteries! There's something about a hook, a crime, an eerie atmosphere, an unsolved drama.
- Throughout the New Testament, particularly in Paul's writings, we hear about the mystery of Christ and the gospel. What is that? And what's so mysterious?
- Col. 2:2-3 "Mysterious" describes the way of Jesus
- It's mysterious because it was previously not known. (1 Cor. 16:25-27)
- It's mysterious because it was previously not understood. (Mark 4:11-12 and 1 Cor. 2:6-8)
- It's mysterious because it was previously not available. (Eph. 3:1-6)
- This mystery is so much more than knowledge it has to do with experience.
- Gen. 4:1 And the man had relations with his wife Eve... Most translations footnote this with the fact that "had relations" is literally "knew" – this is experiential!
